## Recreation Permit

TO ENTER AND REMAIN ON ABORIGINAL LAND

THIS PERMIT IS SUBJECT TO GENERAL CONDITIONS (ATTACHED) AND SPECIAL CONDITIONS OUTLINED BELOW. Please read and initial the attached General Conditions

The person whose name is set out below is authorised to enter onto Aboriginal Land within Recreation Areas (refer to Visitor Information Guide) for recreational purposes only.

# GENERAL CONDITIONS - RECREATION PERMIT

## Definitions:

**Aboriginal Land** – means Aboriginal Land as defined in the *Aboriginal Land Rights (Northern Territory) Act 1976 (ALRA)* and includes the Recreation Areas within the Groote Archipelago and includes the roads bordered by the Aboriginal Land and seas adjoining Aboriginal Land and includes any Aboriginal Land traversed by the Permit Holder to gain access to the Recreation Areas.

**Dependent(s)** – means a dependent of the Permit Holder under the age of 15 years and residing at the same address as the Permit Holder.

**Permit Holder** – means the person named on the Recreation Permit and includes any 'Dependent(s)' and/or 'Bona Fide Visitor(s)' of the Permit Holder.

**Recreation Areas** – mean the areas delineated in green on the Visitor Information Guide, a copy of which is available from the Anindilyakwa Land Council (ALC), and is also displayed on the Land Closure Noticeboard in Alyangula.

**Special Conditions** – means any additional conditions that may be attached to the Recreation Permit from time to time and which will have effect after appropriate notice to current Recreation Permit holders.

**Visitor** – means any person visiting the Groote Archipelago for a period of 4 weeks or less in one year.

This permit is issued on the basis that persons to whom it is issued enter Aboriginal Land at their own risk and agree that none of the ALC, its members and employees, traditional Aboriginal owners, the Anindilyakwa Land Trust, or the occupiers of the Aboriginal Land entered by the Permit Holders are liable either jointly or severally for any loss, damage or liability of any kind whatsoever however arising out of or in relation to the entry of the permit holders onto Aboriginal Land.

This permit is issued subject to the General Conditions contained herein and any Special Conditions and may be amended or revoked either temporarily or permanently if any General Condition or Special Condition is breached, or if deemed appropriate by the ALC.

This permit is issued on the condition that the Permit Holder obeys all directions by Aboriginal owners and any persons delegated the authority by the ALC and may be revoked at any time in accordance with the relevant provisions of the *ALRA*.

This permit authorises the Permit Holder to enter Recreation Areas for recreational purposes only. This permit does not authorise entry to any buildings, dwellings or living areas or camps on Aboriginal Land without the express consent of the owner or occupier.

This permit does not entitle the Permit Holder to enter or remain on any Aboriginal sacred site or site of significance and any such entrance on and/or disturbance to a sacred site or site of significance shall constitute a breach of the *Northern Territory Aboriginal Sacred Sites Act* and the *ALRA*.

Firearms must not be carried on to Aboriginal Land without prior written approval from the ALC, and any Permit Holder that is found to carry a firearm on to Aboriginal Land without such approval shall be liable for prosecution under the *Firearms Act* and their Recreation Permit will be revoked.

Liquor is not permitted in Recreation Areas. The Permit Holder is responsible for complying with all rules and restrictions made under the *Liquor Act (NT)* in relation to liquor on Aboriginal land.

This permit must be carried at all times by the Permit Holder whilst on Aboriginal Land and intertidal zones and produced for inspection on demand by a member of the NT Police Force and any persons delegated the authority by the ALC.

For the avoidance of doubt, Permit Holders will be held accountable for the actions and behaviour of their Dependent(s) and/or Visitors when their Dependent(s) and/or Visitors are on Aboriginal Land as if such actions and behaviour were undertaken by the Permit Holder.

All gates are to be left open or closed as found.

The Permit Holder must observe all signs carrying warnings or otherwise and must comply with all reasonable directions of the NT Police or any persons delegated the authority by the ALC in respect to entry onto Aboriginal Land.

This permit does not authorise the cutting of trees or removal of flora from Aboriginal Land, or disturbance to the wildlife, vegetation, waters, soils or other natural features.

Should the Permit Holder wish to visit Aboriginal Land that is not defined as a Recreation Area, the Permit Holder will need to seek prior written approval from the ALC.

Permit Holders should acquaint themselves with any relevant employer policies that may apply to them when entering Aboriginal Land.

All registrable vehicles driven on Aboriginal Land must be registered and driven by a licensed driver at all times.
